2. INTRODUCTION

The subject area Civil Law I is a compulsory subject area taught in the first year of the Bachelor's Degree in Law, worth 3 ECTS credits. This subject area will introduce the student to the law of persons, with a focus on the different kinds of legal subject (natural person and legal person) and their ability to act by means of legal representation.

For the first part of the course, it is useful to know the basics about the sources of law in the Spanish legal system.

3. SKILLS AND LEARNING OUTCOMES

Basic skills (CB, by their acronym in Spanish):

- CB1: Students have shown their knowledge and understanding of a study area originating from general secondary school education, and are usually at the level where, with the support of more advanced textbooks, they may also demonstrate awareness of the latest developments in their field of study.
- CB2: Students can apply their knowledge to their work or vocation in a professional manner and possess the skills which are usually evident through the forming and defending of opinions and resolving problems within their study area.
- CB4: Students can communicate information, ideas, problems and solutions to both specialist and non-specialist audiences.

- CT2: Ability to analyse and synthesise: be able to break down complex problems into manageable blocks; evaluate other options and perspectives to find the ideal solution. Synthesising to reduce the complexity and better understand the situation and/or solve problems.

- CT4: Oral or written communication: Ability to communicate and gather information, ideas, opinions and viewpoints to understand and be able to act, spoken through words or gestures or written through words and/or graphic elements.
- CT6: Information management: Ability to seek, choose, analyse and integrate information from diverse sources.

Specific skills (CE, by their acronym in Spanish):

- CE1: Ability to navigate the framework of legislation, legal doctrine and case law governing public and private legal relations.
- CE5: Ability to make convincing legal arguments.
- CE10: Ability to understand the differences between the various fields within the legal profession.

Learning outcomes (RA, by their acronym in Spanish):

- RA1: Knowledge of the law of persons and its relationship with other branches of law.
- RA2: Reflect on the different kinds of civil status a person may have.
- RA3: Understand the functions of a legal person, specifically associations and foundations.
- RA4: Reflect on the different kinds of representation available.
