The Professional Practice Module is an optional 6 ECTS module in which students apply and practice the competencies and knowledge in natural business environments within a financial sector company. The student will perform professional tasks under the guidance of a company supervisor and an academic tutor, who will guide this practical application process of the program's competencies and content.

## 3. LEARNING OUTCOMES

### Knowledge

CON1. Identify the national and international regulation systems for financial markets and instruments, which allow a more thorough approach to financial decision making.

CON2. Understand the instruments used in financial planning, analysis and the assessment of the company's financial position and investments.

CON3. Identify inorganic growth / business restructuring strategies, based on the identification of risk and fiscal optimisation strategies.

CON4. Identify the key technological, IT and financial tools (fintech) currently available in the financial sphere.
