TRANSFER OF UNIVERSITY ACTIVITY CREDITS

In accordance with legislation, students may receive academic credit of up to 6 ECTS for participation in extracurricular activities in the following fields: Culture, Sport, Student Council, Solidarity, Cooperation and others.

Details of activities which may be recognised:

- Attendance and active participation in seminars, conferences and workshops. Depending on the activity, a summary, reflection or final report may be requested. Recognition: depending on the activity duration.
- Participation in professional and faculty laboratory sessions. Recognition: depending on the duration of the commitment.
- Coordination and participation with clubs and student associations. Submission of activity schedule and report. Recognition of up to 4 ECTS.



- Participation in the Council of Delegates (student representation body). Submission of activity schedule and report. Acknowledgements: 1 ECTS.
- Participation in cultural passport activities. Only activities with organisations with a signed and current agreement will be recognised. Recognition: minimum 8 activities will equal 1 ECTS.
- Participation in volunteering work on a national level. Recognition: minimum 2 hours per week for each 1 ECTS.
- Participation in the Development Cooperation project (international volunteering). Recognition: up to 4 FCTS
