

Students coming from a member country of the European Union can apply for the **European Health Insurance Card** to access the Spanish health system. For further information and to apply, visit the <u>official website of the European Commission</u>.

The University **recommends all international students take out private health insurance**; it is important to be covered in case of an emergency or unexpected situation.

We offer a **health insurance policy with Nueva Mutua Sanitaria**, which also allows you to **apply for and renew your student visa** to meet all the Spanish Government's requirements for this process. You can take it out at any time and **from your country of origin** via the following <u>link</u>.







Students who need a visa must apply for one themselves at their nearest Spanish **Consulate or Embassy**.

Visit the website of the <u>Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation of Spain</u> to find out the address of the Spanish Consulate or Embassy in each country, as well as the application process and documents needed.

The following is an **indicative list** of the requirements and documents needed to obtain a visa.



Passport: valid for at least the period for which the stay is requested (this must be presented by the student).

Financial evidence: proof that you have sufficient funds (to be provided by the student).

Admissions letter: from the educational institution (this will be provided by Universidad Europea).

Criminal record certificate: to be provided by the student.

Fee: you must have paid the fee for processing your application.

Health insurance: private health insurance including repatriation costs (to be provided and paid for by the student).

Access Documentation

These are the academic documents that **you must provide for admission to the University's courses**. It is **important to start the procedures in good time**; it can take several weeks to certify and obtain apostilles for documents or have prior studies recognised.

Cost of living in Tenerife

<u>Tenerife</u> offers a great variety of culinary and leisure activities

The average cost of living is difficult to calculate, but we have listed some figures that may help you:

- Renting a studio can cost between
 500 and 900 euros per month,
 depending on the area. Click here to
 see the different <u>districts</u> in Tenerife.
- Utilities (water, electricity and gas) vary according to the time of year but, roughly speaking, they could cost around 90 euros per month.
- A monthly shop could cost around
 120 euros per month
- Mobile tariffs can vary between 20 and 50 euros per month, while home internet is around 50 euros per month.

- Car: Exit TF5 via Ramblas to Calle del Pilar.
- Public transport:
 - From San Cristóbal de La Laguna: Take Line 1 of the Tenerife Tram to *Teatro Guimerá* and walk for 1 minute.
 - From El Puerto de la Cruz: 103 bus, from Intercambiador del Puerto de la Cruz to Intercambiador de Santa Cruz. Then take Tram Line 1 to Teatro Guimerá and walk for 1 minute.

- Car: Junction 34 of the TF-5.
- Public transport:
 - From San Cristóbal de La Laguna: Take the 108 bus from Intercambiador Laguna to Estación la Orotava and walk for 9 minutes.
 - From Santa Cruz de Tenerife: Take the 106 bus, from Intercambiador Santa Cruz to Enlace Orotava and walk for 17 minutes.
 - From El Puerto de la Cruz

 Take the Line 363, from Puerto de la Cruz to Enlace Orotava and walk for 17 minutes.
 Take the 345 bus from La Caldera to Estación la Orotava

and walk for 10 minutes.



There are two ways to travel around Tenerife by public transport:



Bus: <u>TITSA</u> manages the buses on the island. You can buy a ticket via:

- Buy tickets for each journey when you get on the bus.
- Or a monthly pass cost from 15 euros for under 30s.

Tram: there are 2 tram lines that connect Santa Cruz de Tenerife and San Cristóbal de La Laguna, managed by <u>Metropolitano de Tenerife</u>:

- Line 1: Santa Cruz-La Laguna.
- Line 2: La Cuesta-Tíncer.

You can buy a single ticket or pass at the machines available at each tram stop.





Foreigner Identification Number (NIE)*

Generally speaking, the visa issued by Spain allows you to move freely between the countries in <u>the Schengen area.</u> The visa is not valid outside this area.

What is the NIE?

The **NIE is the identification number for foreigners**. This number is unique and personal.



If you are a national or resident of an EU country, you will be given a NIE number when you **apply for registration in the Register of EU Citizens**. To obtain this certificate, book an appointment here.



If you are a **national of a country outside the EU**, the NIE number will be included on your **student card**.

The student card will replace the student visa issued in your country of origin and provides a legal basis for your stay in Spain.

You must apply for it within one month of entering Spain and before your visa expires. This card will assign you a Foreigner Identification Number (NIE). It is not recommended to leave Spain until you have this card.

How do I apply for it?

To apply for the NIE (registration in the Register of EU Citizens) or the Student Card, you will need to book an appointment online via:

https://sede.administracionespublicas.gob.es/pagina/index/directorio/icpplus

Online:

- 1. Select the province where you are going to study
- 2. Then select, "trámites cuerpo nacional de policía" [national police procedures] and the procedure you wish to carry out:
 - a. "toma de huellas" [fingerprints] for the issuance of the student card.
 - **b.** or "**certificado de registro de ciudadano de la UE**" [EU citizen registration certificate] in the case of EU citizens.

The system will assign you an appointment, indicating the **place, date and time** when you will be seen

For your day-to-day finances, we recommend opening a Spanish bank account and suggest:

 Online bank account with N26: in just 8 minutes you can open a bank account with the YOU rate free for 12 months, an exclusive offer for students of Universidad Europea.

Once you have enrolled and have access to the <u>student portal</u>, click on the "International IN-OUT" section to find the link for opening a bank account with N26.

Bear in mind that banks may ask to see your Foreigner Identification Number (NIE) / Foreigner Identification Card (TIE) to open your bank account.






Academic calendar and personal timetable

- The first term begins in September and finishes at the end of January, with a two-week holiday at Christmas (usually the final week of December and the first week of January).
- The second term begins in February and finishes in the middle of June, with a oneweek holiday during Holy Week (the date varies every year).


